### Dear church Members and Friends

Not exactly the nostalgic moment we like to show in our Christmas Nativity plays, yet this rustic scene marked the greatest event in the history of humankind.

God's Son became human and came to earth to save us. God had promised to send a Messiah, one who would save His people. He could have easily burst on the scene as a full-grown man, a six-foot warrior with fiery eyes and arms of steel. This was, after all, what many people were looking for and expecting, but that wasn't how God chose to do it. Instead, against all expectations, our Messiah was born in a stable as a tiny, vulnerable baby and cradled in the arms of his very young and courageous mother, Mary. He was, a very small package, wrapped in rags, given from the heart of God - the perfect gift.

God gave His only Son to us, to live and die in our place so that we, in all our brokenness, could know forgiveness. He came so that we could know what love feels like, real love – love that never leaves, love that never disappoints, love that is never betrayed. He sent His Son into our world to bring us hope and love and peace and joy.

The Rumbling Bridge Community Hydro Society has generously awarded a grant of £5,000 to Fossoway Church Hall from its profits from 2020/21. This is to support the provision of non-religious meetings/events held in the church acknowledging the difficulties caused by the pandemic restrictions and resultant reduction in income due to the cancellation of many bookings.

Members of the Kirk Session are exploring a selection of ideas, which will upgrade and enhance our facilities, to encourage the return of the groups that used to use our facilities and encourage others to do so. Please contact me if you have an idea that you think we could consider.

# **Money News**

The accounts for the period up to 30 September have already been passed to the Kirk Session.

Our Total Offerings are now similar to last year at £24,665 compared to £24,596. This was helped by the increase in our Open Plate where we were able to put the proceeds of a funeral, approximately £300. Our Other Ordinary General Income came in at £789, mainly due to the Fossoway Gathering and from October we have re-started Refresh and the Film Nights so this should increase closer to the figure of £1,099 last year, which covered the period from January up to mid-March.

Overall our income is down to £34,088 compared to the £35,018 of last year.

Under Expenditure the first section is National Ministry and Mission & Wider Work coming in at £20,661 as against £24,509 last year.

The second section is Local Staffing Costs totalling £3,341 as against £3,586 of last year. The major difference here is that we are only paying for our church officer. The Other Salaries figure is down to £2,574 as against £2,959 the previous year when we had organists up to mid-March.

The third section is Building Costs at £6,133 as against £6,473 with nothing of note happening this quarter.

The fourth section is Other Local Costs at  $\mathfrak{L}1,568$  as against  $\mathfrak{L}1,583$  last year. Our Telephone, Posts etc increased due to Zoom costs and the Web Support with the Other expenses being minimal as against the norm.

Out Total expenses are down to £31,703 from last year's £36,151.

For the Fabric Fund there has been nothing this quarter but from October we have had to spend money on new lighting and some further smaller items.

In our General account with church head office we had to withdraw a further £3,000 leaving us with only £4,800 in our cash reserves. During October I have had to withdraw a further £3,000 and with our having to pay out a sum of £2,435 to Kythe (this is the amount as deducted from our Ministries & Mission allocation) this will leave us in a difficult financial position. We will not be able to pay the usual £5,000 to Kythe this year. However with the fact of the National Giving Campaign initiated by church head office our generous congregation have given us approximately another £1,300 which will greatly assist us.


