A Word From The Minister

August 25th 2023

Dear Church Members and Friends,

Just a couple of weeks ago when I was off on annual leave, I was at the stables where my daughter keeps her horse, watching the horses galloping about in the sunshine and thinking about just how quickly this year seems to be galloping by.

I find it is always helpful to have a break away from things so that one can come back refreshed and renewed. Sometimes after a break away some of the problems that were so important just seem to have disappeared and the insurmountable obstacles no longer seem so daunting. A little time, distance and perspective can change the way we perceive so many things. The world continues, the seasons change, the year goes round no matter what we do or how we may worry.

I think it's this kind of sense of things that Jesus talks about in this section of Matthew's Gospel:

²⁵ "That is why I tell you not to worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food and drink, or enough clothes to wear. Isn't life more than food, and your body more than clothing? ²⁶ Look at the birds. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for your heavenly Father feeds them. And aren't you far more valuable to him than they are? ²⁷ Can all your worries add a single moment to your life?

²⁸ "And why worry about your clothing? Look at the lilies of the field and how they grow. They don't work or make their clothing, ²⁹ yet Solomon in all his glory was not dressed as beautifully as they are. ³⁰ And if God cares so wonderfully for wildflowers that are here today and thrown into the fire tomorrow, he will certainly care for you. (Matt 6:25-30 NLV)

Back at the beginning of the year we were worried about how we would find the money needed to repair our church roof. We set a date of September for the roof repair to begin and we wondered how we would ever find £30,000. Now we are at the end of August and we praise God because prayers have been answered and we find that we have raised the money needed for the repair, however, we now find that the repairs are having to be postponed until next spring because the builder has other projects that have been held up due to the rainy summer that we have experienced.

Your Kirk Session and I wish to express our grateful thanks to all of you who have supported all our fund-raising initiatives and given us all the donations so that we are in this worry free place and can look forwards to the roof repair finally being carried out. Thanks as well to all those who worked so hard on all the fund-raising events e.g. the Coronation events, the Fashion show and the Silent Auction, a lot of hard work for some but so much enjoyed by all of us.

Last year, and into this year, the Perth Presbytery Mission Plan was a cause of concern for many folks and of course especially so for all those at Cleish Church who were told that their building was to be closed. The Kirk Sessions of Cleish and Fossoway are still at the beginning of this new journey for both our churches and we met together on 13th Sept to start thinking about how our two churches may be united. I am sure this is just the start of many such meetings.

We started the year with a joint service at Orwell Church to mark how the churches in our Kinross-shire Parish Grouping have made a commitment to work more closely together in the ensuing months and years ahead. We also had a Parish Grouping conference on 14th June which was very well attended by elders from all our churches.

We seem to be approaching the end of our summer now. The days are getting shorter and folks are putting the heating on again and our church life is getting busy once more as we pick up the reins and continue our journey in Christ. As we do so we will miss the guiding presence of our Session Clerk Janet Harper, who has decided to have a longer break and take a year's sabbatical. I can never praise Janet enough for all she does and has done for our church. She has always been such a dedicated and hard worker and has been a wonderful and wise counsellor, support and guide for me in all my ministry here and for our Kirk Session as well. We will miss her but our prayers and well wishes go with her and she is not going far away...

This could have been another worrying time for us as we sought someone to take on the Office of Session Clerk, however, prayers have been answered yet again and we are very grateful to Anne McKay for taking on this role. It will take a little while for Anne to get a hold of everything but we pray for your patience and your help as she takes on these duties and we also pray for God's blessing upon her as she takes up the reins.

Through all the troublesome and worrying times God is with us. When we remember God's love and care for us, his son our Saviour walking beside us and his Holy Spirit guiding and uplifting us, the clamour of the worrying and troublesome times seem to disappear and the quietness and calm and peace of God's love creeps in.
