A Word From The Minister

7th November 2024.

Hello friends,

I was pleased that both Cleish & Fossoway Churches are sharing the content of their parish news.

As we move closer to Christmas and the end of 2024... our thoughts are drawn to wonder about what this new year might bring for us individually and as a Church community. We will be part of a much bigger united congregation and we will be closing 2 of our 5 buildings across Kinross-shire. Now I don't want to ignore the fact that these 2 buildings have seen many of its congregation and its leaders pass through their doors... in both happy and also sad times; Cleish & Portmoak, and of course we lament with the faithful members who worship there each week.

I am drawn to a few verses from Romans that I read this morning about God's gifts.

"We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."

We all have something special to bring, even if it doesn't always feel like it. Sometimes we can fall into comparing our gifts or downplaying them, but here's the thing: God gave each of us our own set of gifts, unique to us. Some are natural encouragers; others are strong leaders, while some show care through quiet acts of service. It's not about having one "big" gift; it's about using what we have, wherever we are.

I once heard someone say that if you want to see God's love in action, look at the variety in a church community. The teacher shares insight, the helper gives their time, and the encourager lifts spirits with a few kind words. Together, our gifts reflect different pieces of God's love. So, let's lean into these gifts. Instead of comparing or doubting, we can ask, "How can I use what I've been given?" Our efforts, however small, become a way of sharing God's love with those around us.

With hands that serve and words that cheer, Each gift is given, purpose clear. In teaching, helping, sharing grace, We see your love in every place.

One heart, one voice, together strong,

In every gift, we all belong.

So let us use what we possess,

To bring the world your tenderness.

My role as we move forward into 2025... with God's help will be to work with a newly formed vacancy committee to call a new full time Minister who will be based in Crook of Devon and work as part of a team ministry team of 2 full time ministers and a part time minister across the new united area of Kinross-shire.

My prayer is that you use the gifts you've been given and to see the value and the difference they can make. I urge you to use these gifts to encourage, serve, and uplift others.

May we use what we have with joy and sincerity, knowing that every offering, big or small, can show God's love.
